As Light of Hearts Villa prepares for this year's #weGIVECATHOLIC campaign, we are deeply grateful for the extraordinary generosity and faith-filled leadership of Michael and Adrienne Manella. Their compassion and commitment have already touched countless lives at Light of Hearts Villa and their story reflects what it truly means to give from the heart.

Rooted in Faith and Family

Michael and Adrienne were both raised by faith-centered parents who instilled in them the values of integrity, humility and service. "We were raised by hardworking middle-class parents who had a deep-rooted belief in God and stressed doing the right things in life," they shared. Those lessons became the foundation for how they live and give today.

Outside of their professional lives, the Manellas enjoy spending time outdoors, hiking, golfing and sharing meaningful moments with friends. But perhaps most importantly, they've carried their families' values of compassion and generosity into every season of their lives.

A Personal Connection to Senior Care

Having cared for aging parents—Adrienne's mother lived nearly 90 years, Michael's father to 92 and his mother to 99—they have a deep appreciation for the importance of senior engagement and care.

"As they aged, we saw how even simple interactions could make a difference in their day," they said. "When Sister Anita [Maroun] talked about the financial challenges many residents experience, it immediately caused us to want to help ensure they have access to those same kinds of activities."

Their empathy and lived experience have become a guiding force behind their commitment to ensuring all residents can live joyfully, regardless of financial circumstance.

A Lifelong Friendship with Sister Anita

Michael first met Sister Anita Maroun, SC, now president of the Light of Hearts Villa Board of Directors, while both were law students at the University of Akron in the early 1990s. Their friendship has remained strong ever since.

"Our introduction to Light of Hearts Villa was a natural extension of our admiration of her and her work," Michael shared. "We see the great work and genuine passion to serve that the team at Light of Hearts Villa exhibits. We also recognize the challenges a smaller nonprofit faces competing with larger, national charities and wanted to assist in our small way."

A Legacy of Compassionate Giving

The Manella's faith and gratitude have inspired them to support both the Sister Helen T. Scasny, SC Benevolent Fund, which ensures residents are never turned away due to financial need, and the newly established Sister Anita Fund, which enriches the lives of residents through meaningful programs and activities.

"We believe that quality of life and the care received should not diminish as you age or as your financial situation changes. Seeing the work of the team at Light of Hearts Villa and knowing what a special person Sister Anita is made it an easy decision to do so."

For Michael and Adrienne, giving is not about recognition—it’s about faith and service. “There are several sayings that guide us,” they shared. “‘To whom much is given, much is expected,’ and ‘whenever you are in a position to help someone, be glad and always do it, because that’s God answering someone else’s prayers.’”

As we approach #weGIVECATHOLIC on Tuesday, December 2, the generosity of the Manellas reminds us that every gift—large or small—makes an eternal difference in the lives of those who call Light of Hearts Villa home. the pleasure of helping Martha weekly with her laundry and housekeeping needs, but it didn’t stop there,” Taushe said. “I would help prepare meals, make root beer floats or order our favorite snacks from Arby’s. I made sure I visited her daily on my breaks, because if I didn’t, she’d fuss at me!” When Martha passed, Taushe was deeply saddened, but was comforted knowing how much Martha and her family appreciated the care and friendship she gave.

Outside of work, Taushe is a creative soul with many hobbies. She enjoys painting, drawing, and has a passion for makeup, video editing, making music beats and even karaoke. Her wide range of talents adds another layer to her vibrant personality.

Taushe’s playful spirit also shines through when she dresses up for Halloween and participates in spirit days. Her festive attire and enthusiasm for these events always bring smiles and a sense of fun to everyone around her. ♦

AN UPDATE FROM THE SISTERS OF CHARITY HEALTH SYSTEM

Guided by faith and compassion, the Health System integrates grantmaking foundations, elder care ministries, outreach ministries and neighborhood initiatives to advance health, healing and well-being in a holistic way across Cleveland, Canton and South Carolina. A MESSAGE FROM MICHAEL GOAR

President & CEO, Sisters of Charity Health System

As we move through this season of change, I'm filled with gratitude for the tremendous work happening across the Sisters of Charity Health System and all of our ministries—including the incredible team at Light of Hearts Villa.

Over the past few months, our family of ministries has seen remarkable momentum. In July, we celebrated two milestone events in Cleveland—the groundbreaking of the new Women Religious Archives Collaborative Heritage Center, a \$22 million project that will preserve and honor the legacy of Catholic Sisters, and the blessing of the new Joseph's Home facility, now a fully accessible space offering men experiencing homelessness a place to heal and rebuild. Both stand as powerful symbols of faith in action. Across town from Light of Hearts Villa, its sister ministry, Regina Health Center, ranked #7 in the entire State of Ohio on *Newsweek's America's Best Nursing Homes 2026* list for facilities with 50-99 beds, continuing a long run of national recognition.

That same momentum continues with exciting growth at the St. Vincent Charity Health & Healing Hub in Cleveland, where partnerships are expanding to address food insecurity, youth homelessness and neighborhood revitalization. It's also drawing interest from public officials and partners who see its promise for Cleveland's Central neighborhood, including recent visits with U.S. Senator Bernie Moreno and Cleveland Mayor Justin Bibb's office. And soon, the new Sr. Ignatia Gavin, CSA, Center for Addiction Medicine will provide a space of healing, hope and community connection right in the heart of Cleveland.

Across all of our ministries—from Healthy Learners in South Carolina welcoming new executive director Derek Cromwell to the South Carolina Center for Fathers and Families receiving a new \$6.25 million fatherhood grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to ongoing innovation at the Early Childhood Resource Center in Canton—our mission remains strong: to provide help, offer hope and restore health to those in need.

Just as the changing seasons remind us of renewal, this time of year calls us to reflect on our shared commitment to serve others. Thank you for being such an important part of this mission. Together, we continue to build a foundation of faith, compassion and lasting impact.

A Golden Love Story: Hal & Judy Rodgers Celebrate 50 Years of Marriage



“Communicate, keep God first and don’t go into marriage thinking divorce is an option.” That sage advice has been the secret to 50 years of marriage for residents Hal and Judy Rodgers. On September 20, they celebrated their 50th anniversary by renewing their vows in the Light of Hearts Villa chapel, surrounded by a small group of loved ones, marking five decades of faith, laughter and deep devotion.

Their story began in 1974 in Pennsylvania, when Hal—in the midst of a life transition—glanced across the room at a friend’s house and instantly knew Judy was someone special. “Wow! Who’s she?” he thought. A year and a half later, the two were married in a church ceremony in Baden, Pennsylvania, with family and friends by their side.

Throughout their marriage, they built a life rooted in faith, hard work and shared adventure. Hal worked at Lubrizol for 30 years, while Judy managed payroll and labor reporting at a power plant. Together they enjoyed camping, hiking, fishing and baking, always finding joy in each other’s company.

A Faith-Filled Journey

Faith played a pivotal role in their journey. Judy’s steady prayers eventually led Hal to find his own relationship with Christ, a moment that brought deep strength to their bond. “The power of prayer is wonderful. It will truly heal,” Judy said.

Their decision to move to Light of Hearts Villa was made with great care and intention. After spending time at a different facility, they realized it wasn’t the right long-term fit. Hal, being older than Judy, worried about what might occur if something happened to him first and whether Judy would be well supported. When they discovered that residents at their previous facility could be asked to leave if they ran out of money, they knew they needed a place that offered more stability, compassion and security.

With the help of their family and a friend in the senior living field, that’s when they found Light of Hearts Villa—and everything changed.



A Place to Call Home

“It took me a while to call this place home,” Hal shared. “But now, it’s very much our home.” The couple describes the environment as peaceful, loving and full of genuine care. They especially appreciate how team members have taken the time to learn their preferences and needs, from the meals they enjoy to the little routines that make their days easier.

“There’s a warmth here,” Hal said. “The staff, the residents—everyone makes it feel like family.”

Today, Hal and Judy continue to enjoy life’s simple pleasures: Chinese food and pizza, shopping trips, listening to music, and spending quiet time together. Their vow renewal was a beautiful, heartfelt celebration of love, commitment and the peace that comes from walking through life together, hand in hand, with faith at the center. ♦

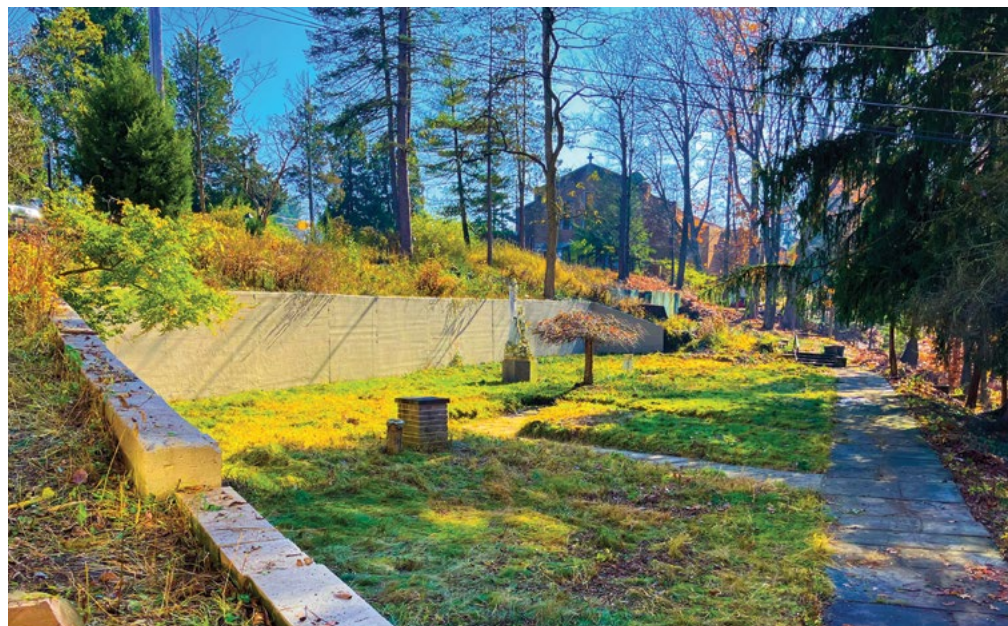


important work, and we'd love your help.

Myth vs. Reality:

Reality:

Touring early helps families feel confident and prepared when the time comes. Our team can answer questions about care levels, financial options and the admissions process so families can make informed decisions with peace of mind.

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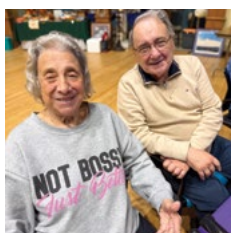
