Touching the Lives of More Than 1 Million People in 2025

The Sisters of Charity Health System oversees a diverse array of ministries, programs and initiatives dedicated to health, human services, housing, education and spiritual care, as well as grantmaking foundations in Ohio and South Carolina focused on reducing poverty, working to end homelessness, and improving educational and health outcomes in underserved communities. Headquartered in Cleveland, the Health System continues the 175-year mission of the Sisters of Charity of St. Augustine to heal, serve and advocate for individuals and families across communities in Ohio and South Carolina.

Outreach Ministries

ST. VINCENT CHARITY HEALTH & HEALING HUB Cleveland | stvincenthhh.org

The St. Vincent Charity Health & Healing Hub, a neighborhood legacy initiative of the Sisters of Charity Health System, began critical planning and development in 2025 to be able to serve as a campus hub for the community, offering comprehensive programming and services to address the most critical needs in Cleveland's Central neighborhood. This initiative will continue to serve the neighborhood of the former St. Vincent Charity Medical Center. In 2025, more than 10,000 people were served by the initial programs and initiatives of the Health & Healing Hub. These include:

Cleveland Central Promise Neighborhood

An initiative of the Sisters of Charity Health System, the Promise Neighborhood includes wrap-around services that support the Health & Healing Hub with focused efforts on breaking the cycle of poverty by working to improve outcomes for children, families and the community.

- 204 students served at Marion-Sterling School
- 315 afterschool programming encounters in fall semester
- 195+ Jr. Chef cooking class encounters
- 250+ weekend meal packages distributed in fall semester
- 82 residents (adults and children) participated in a series of Parent Cafes
- 56 adults participated in Hispanic Heritage Month celebrations at two housing complexes

Internal Medicine

- 680 patients and 2,300+ patient encounters

Sr. Miriam's Kitchen/St. Vincent Charity Mission Kitchen

- 3,298 meals served, 1,261 boxes of produce and 1,353 canned goods provided to Central residents
- 300 meals per month served at the Men's Shelter on Lakeside Avenue

Outpatient Behavioral Health

- 322 patients and 2,300+ patient encounters

Outpatient Pharmacy

- 9,512 patients served
- 16,296 prescriptions filled

ST. VINCENT CHARITY HEALTH & HEALING HUB.

Rosary Hall

A program of the Sr. Ignatia Gavin, CSA, Center for Addiction Medicine, Rosary Hall provides intensive outpatient programming (IOP), medication assisted therapy (MAT), and aftercare and ongoing support.

- 165 patients served and 2,700 patient encounters
- 500+ sessions held
- Graduates of Rosary Hall reported an overall 96.5% satisfaction with Intensive Outpatient Program
- 100% of graduates reported the ability to enjoy things (life events, activities, etc.) without the use of substances
- 100% of graduates reported having the tools to manage triggers and cravings

Sr. Ignatia Gavin, CSA, Center for Addiction Medicine

Opening fall 2026! Planning for The Sr. Ignatia Gavin, CSA, Center for Addiction Medicine began in 2025. The Center builds on the enduring legacy of Rosary Hall by expanding services, partnerships and spaces of healing. The Center will include enhanced treatment areas and new places for reprieve, prayer and reflection, community engagement and learning within the Sisters of Charity Health System building.



JOSEPH & MARY'S HOME Cleveland | jmhome.org

Northeast Ohio's first and only medical respite care provider for adults experiencing homelessness.

- 66 adults served in residence and as alumni
- 76% of clients medically stable at discharge
- 72% of clients discharged into permanent housing
- Completed \$2M+ renovation of the new Joseph's Home facility

EARLY CHILDHOOD RESOURCE CENTER Canton, Ohio | ecresourcecenter.org

Promotes the healthy development of young children by strengthening families, improving the quality of early learning experiences, increasing school and community readiness, and informing public policy.

- 2,030 children served statewide through the SPARK kindergarten readiness program, with nearly 19,000 in-home visits
- 20,300 books distributed through the SPARK program
- 450+ dads received fatherhood services
- 326 families assisted in finding quality child care
- 8,610 early childhood educators attended 631 trainings offered by ECRC staff
- 709 childcare programs served in 6-county region





HEALTHY LEARNERS

Removes children's health barriers to learning through screenings, referrals and access to medical services.

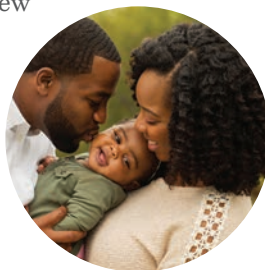
- **3,700+** children served, providing more than **19,000** health care services and **45,000** vision, hearing and dental screenings for **22,950** children in **257** schools in **24** school districts across South Carolina
- Expanded into **3** new counties (Abbeville, Spartanburg, Darlington)
- Added **2** new community partners and **7** new service providers

SOUTH CAROLINA CENTER FOR FATHERS AND FAMILIES

South Carolina | scfathersandfamilies.com

Provides resources and tools for fathers to be great dads to help children and families thrive.

- **3,400+** fathers served in all **46** counties (reaching **192%** of its goals) with nearly **3,900** children positively affected by services to their fathers
- Helped fathers earn **\$416,815** in new income through job placements
- Opened **3** new offices, bringing the total to **17**
- Awarded a **\$6.25 million**, five-year federal HHS fatherhood grant
- Helped the state avoid **\$1.55 million** in incarceration costs
- **\$115.8 million** potential boost to South Carolina's economy from these gains

LIGHT OF HEARTS VILLA

Assisted living and memory care.

- Nearly **100** residents receive compassionate care annually
- Raised a record-breaking **\$418,000** during the 2025 #weGIVECATHOLIC campaign from **251** donors and two **\$100,000** matching gifts, directly supporting residents who have outlived their financial resources
- Supported the early-stage launch of the Vincentian Pathways Restoration Project, raising more than **\$20,000** in its first phase and securing a **\$50,000** matching gift for this historic grounds restoration effort
- Seton Safety Net food pantry distributed **1,325** food items/paper products and more than **\$5,000** in cash and Giant Eagle Gift cards to seniors in the community experiencing food shortfall

Skilled nursing and assisted living.

- **296** residents served (lay people, Religious and clergy)
- **Ranked #7** in Ohio in *Newsweek* magazine's "Best Nursing Homes," for a 50-99 bed facility, the second year in a row ranked in the top 10 in Ohio
- Annual Holy-In-One Golf Outing raised more than **\$295,000**, including a record-setting **\$67,000** "Fund-A-Need" money that went toward bridging the Medicaid reimbursement gap

(now open in 2026!) After a brief pause, grantmaking returns in 2026. The Foundation primarily serves Cleveland's Central neighborhood, addressing the needs of the poor and underserved by addressing the social drivers of health. These include the areas of health, education and social services.

Addresses the needs of the underserved by understanding the root causes of poverty, nurturing the growth of healthy communities, emphasizing youth and family, and measuring the outcomes of these efforts.

- **\$3,495,131** in grants distributed in Stark and surrounding counties to more than **50** organizations in three strategic areas: responsive efforts, strategic collaborations and foundation-led initiatives
- Marking **30 years** in 2026, the Foundation has distributed nearly **\$88 million** to organizations reflecting its commitment to uplift the poor and underserved

Works to change systems and reduce poverty in South Carolina through grants, advocacy and information sharing.

- More than **\$2,970,250** in grants awarded to **235** nonprofit organizations
- Celebrating **30 years** in 2026, having distributed more than **\$82 million** to over **1,100** nonprofits working to reduce poverty in the lives of individuals and families in the Palmetto State



Fundraising Highlights



In the spirit of the Sisters of Charity of St. Augustine, our mission is to extend the healing ministry of Jesus to God's people — and it couldn't be done without a wide range of partners and supporters who help sustain the efforts of the Health System and our ministries, programs and initiatives.

In 2025, the generosity of partners and supporters really was evident across all ministries. Here's a look at fundraising highlights for the entire Sisters of Charity Health System:

- Nearly **\$18 million** funds raised (secured) from more than **2,600** donors
- **\$3.8+ million** from individuals and estates from **2,300** donors (funding increase of **131%** over the course of two years)
- **\$2.1+ million** from businesses and organizations through **247** donors
- **\$1.8+ million** from foundations (**63** funders)
- **\$10+ million** from government sources (**20** funders)
- **\$13+ million** grant funding secured (including government) from **88** funders
- **\$3.6+ million** capital funding secured from 2023-2025
